#### NOVEMBER: MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS THE ORATORY'S NOVEMBER CUSTOMARY

It is the long established custom of the Oratory to have special regard for the Holy Souls in Purgatory especially during the Month of November. This will be reflected in a number of ways during the Month:

 The Fathers will visit the main cemeteries of the City in the first week of November to **bless the graves** of your loved ones. (The Church grants a **Plenary Indulgence** during the Octave, 1-8 November, for those who visit a grave of a loved one within the Octave);

2) There will be a Requiem Mass for all **Benefactors of the Parish** (Parishioners, donors, priests and brothers) who have served here;

 There will be a Requiem Mass for all who have died during the last year;

4) There will be a Requiem Mass for **all alumni** of St Alban's School, Old Illtydians and Brothers.



The Oratory has once again organised special candles for the Holy Souls during the Month of November: one sort for the cemetery to burn on the graves of our loved ones and another sort to burn in the Parish Church. If we cannot get to the cemetery to visit our loved ones, we may, in these circumstances, fulfil the conditions to obtain the November Holy Souls Plenary Indulgence for their souls in the Parish Church when we go to Mass and pray the Holy Rosary or prayers for the Holy Souls.

Two kinds of special Votive Candles for the Holy Souls are now available: one sort for the cemetery to burn on the graves and another sort to burn in the Parish Church, especially before the Shrine of Our Lady of Pity, *Pieta*. If we physically cannot get to the cemetery to visit our loved ones, we may, in these circumstances, fulfil the conditions to obtain the November Holy Souls Indulgence in the Parish Church, when we go to Mass by praying the Holy Rosary or prayers for the Holy Souls.

\* The Solemn Blessing of the Columbarium Garden adjacent to the St Alban's Church will take place after the first Annual Procession to the columbarium concluding the All Souls Day 5:00pm Mass. The Church grants a *plenary indulgence* for those who take part in such a procession with the purpose of praying for the dead. It is a corporal work of mercy to visit a cemetery/columbarium.



The **Annual Act of Remembrance** will begin at 11:55am in St Alban's Church on Remembrance Sunday 10th November 2024. The 10:00am Mass and 11:15am Mass will be Requiems

## Bro Illtyd writes from Seminary...

This week at seminary has been one I will not forget for a long time. Last Saturday, the seminarians went out to Niagara Falls. It started with a 4 Km (2.5 miles in UK currency) hike along the Niagara gorge. The leaves are starting to change colour so it made the stunning views even more special. We had lunch on the rocks by a whirlpool. The walk was described to us beforehand as "leisurely" however it was a bit arduous at points as we had to scale boulders and not slip as we passed miniature waterfalls coming from the side of the gorge. We then went to a Carmelite monastery that is directly behind the falls. We prayed the Rosary and venerated the relics of St. Thérèse of Lisieux as it is her National Shrine. Within the monastery is a wine cellar in which some of us did try some of its produce. We then made our way down to the falls, which are always breath-taking. I am lucky to have seen them at night and now in the full light of day where 681,750 gallons per second over the Canadian Falls. We ventured even closer as we boarded the Hornblower which took us right into the mist. The ponchos provided did help to keep us from being soaked. Afterwards we headed to another local church to pray vespers and to partake in the Canadian delicacy of Swiss Chalet, a chicken and rib joint.

On Wednesday, I was asked to give a presentation to the St. Joseph's Youth Group at the Chaldean Cathedral. We have three seminarians from the Chaldean Church, an Eastern Catholic which uses Syriac in its liturgy and mostly located in the Middle East. The youth group is currently going through a series of talks given by the seminarians on Catholic Social Teaching, and I had the pleasure of covering the Church's Teaching on Bioethics. I covered such topics as IVF, stem cell research and organ donations.

On Friday, I completed my midterm assessment in Canon law. Next week I have to prepare a practice homily for the Solemnity of All Saints. We are approaching the halfway mark of the semester, even though I am enjoying the academic and social side of the seminary, I do miss being back in the Parish.

This is an increase in the previous premium and is subject to a new survey.





There is a saying "Work Smarter Not Harder". There should be a saying "Insulate More, Not Heat More". Through the generosity of benefactors the attics are being insulated to a very high grade. This along with the upgrading of double glazing for the Oratory House will result in the use of heating for the brethren's individual rooms will require less and maintain the warmth more. # Books Woof I Have Read



After reading Peter Seewald's excellent biography of Pope Benedict XVI recently, I decided

that I wanted to read something written by the late Pope himself. After some consideration, I alighted upon '*Jesus of Nazareth: From the Baptism in the Jordan to the Transfiguration*', the composition of which was a project clearly very close to its author's heart.

One of the things which struck me most forcefully about this book was how accessible (and, therefore, how readable) it was. The subject matter is both complicated and, in places, controversial (with different historians and theologians interpreting different events in different ways); but ideas and differences of opinion are presented clearly and in simple terms.

As I have pointed out previously, Pope Benedict was one of the greatest theologians of the twentieth century, but he had a tremendous gift for reaching ordinary souls and presenting the Faith in terms which everyone could understand. In the process, this book corrects common errors which have tended to undermine confidence in Sacred Scripture, and to present the life and teachings of Our Lord in terms which are crisp and clear. Indeed, it is no exaggeration to say that, as I read on, I felt as though I were being shepherded through this great narrative. This was an immensely rewarding read and, I think, a must for any Catholic. I cannot recommend it enough.
