Books Woof I Have Read

This week, I read three books by George Orwell: Nineteen Eighty-Four, The Road to Wigan Pier, and Down & Out In Paris & London. What can I say? I don't get out as much as I'd like! Published in 1937, The Road to

Wigan Pier is a fascinating work. The first part comprises an account of Orwell's investigations (conducted during 1936) into living conditions among the working people of Yorkshire and Lancashire. The second part of the book is autobiographical, in that Orwell focuses upon his own upper-middle class upbringing, and the development of his social conscience.

One of the interesting things about Orwell is that, although he was a self-confessed socialist, he approached his subject in a very intelligent, rationale and carefully-reasoned manner. He was neither a class rebel nor a class warrior. He does not preach to or otherwise lecture his reader. Rather, he focuses upon his concerns for social justice and how working people can be helped to help themselves.

Of course, reading the book now (almost 90 years later), it takes on the added significance of being historically important. When Orwell wrote it, he was interested only in the living conditions of working people; but now, at the close of 2024, it provides us with a detailed insight into the life of those people during the Great Depression. In that respect, it provides some insight both into how far we have and how much more we still need to do.
