
Fr Alexander's 60th Birthday Party

FROM REV. BRO. ILLTYD M.



Books Woof I Have Read



After reading 'Marlborough: His Life & Times', I was interested to read more about the life and reign of Queen Anne. So, this week I have been reading 'Queen Anne: The Politics of Passion', by Lady Anne Somerset. I enjoy reading

Somerset's books because she is very good at entertaining as well as informing her readers. On the very first page of this book, she tells how Queen Anne's father, the future King James II, came to marry her mother, Anne Hyde, when he discovered that she was pregnant with Anne's elder sister (the future Queen Mary II). Somerset then quotes the diarist, Samuel Pepys, who, clearly despairing of any man taking such a rash step, observed that, 'he that doth get a wench with child and marries her afterward: it is as if a man should shit in is hat and then clap it upon his head.' The reign of Queen Anne was one of the most significant periods in British history, both at home and abroad. Most notably, it witnessed the formal union of Scotland with England & Wales, and the emergence of Britain as a leading power following the Duke of Marlborough's stunning victories over Louis XIV's France. Yet, as I noted last week, it is a period in history which most people tend to overlook.

Anne herself is traditionally viewed as weak and easily-led by her favourites, but that is to do her a disservice. Anne had a very clear sense of duty and, like most of the Stuarts, she was stubborn and single-minded. In that sense, she was neither weak nor easily-led. Indeed, it was almost impossible to get her to do anything she did not want to do. Unfortunately, Anne was not very shrewd and made many errors of judgment, especially in her dealings with individuals. Ultimately, this deprived her of the invaluable help and support which would otherwise have been made available to her by loyal and able courtiers. John Churchill, Duke of Marlborough, was one such example. Having rendered her unequal service, Anne abandoned him, ostensibly because she had fallen out with his wife. Perhaps Anne's biggest failing, however, albeit not one for which she can be blamed, was her failure to provide for the succession. Consequently, when she died in 1714, the Crown passed to her relations in Hanover. I thoroughly enjoyed this book and recommend it to anyone with an interest in history.

St. Joseph Vaz, Cong. Orat

Apostle of Ceylon Feast = 16 January

16th January. St. Joseph Vaz, Priest & Oratorian.

At Kandy on the island of Cevlon in the Indian Ocean, Fr Joseph Vaz of Congregation of the Oratory, who with eagerness admirable in laborious travels through the mission camps, tirelessly confirmed in the faith the Catholics who were spread abroad and in hiding, and

who zealously preached the Gospel of Salvation. Known as the "Apostle of Ceylon," Father Vaz entered Ceylon (now Sri Lanka) during the Dutch occupation, when Calvinism was the official religion.

He travelled throughout the island offering Mass and administering the sacraments to groups of Catholics in hiding.

Later in his mission, he found shelter in the Kandyan Kingdom where he was able to work freely. At the time of his death in 1711, Fr. Vaz managed to rebuild the Catholic Church on the island. On 21st January 1995, he was Beatified by Pope St. John Paul II in Colombo. He was Canonised by Pope Francis on 14th January 2015. The Cardiff Oratory has a relic of this extraordinary priest's habit.


