


#### CARDIFF ORATORY CONFESSION TIMES

Unfortunately during the recent high winds a solitary slate was displaced at the apex of the

main church roof. The scaffolding required will cost thousands of pounds, the piece of slate, less that £20! (Such is life). There are various ways in which we can all support the Parish's 2025 Restoration Fundraising. Thank you to the Parishioner who donated £300 in a Gift Aid envelope towards the repair of the church roof.



#### CHURCH ROOF REPAIR

We are hoping that it may now be possible to undertake the repair of the solitary slate on the very top elevation of the church roof by the day hire of a special crane,

mechanical not avian (although the latter feather kind if trained would be decorative and functional, and a welcome meal). The day hire will be £800 so I am most grateful to the parishioner who gift aid donated £300 last Sunday.

### Books Woof I Have Read by Pippo

My regular readers will both recall that, some months ago, I reviewed Andrew Roberts's excellent biography of Napoleon Bonaparte. As I wrote at the time, Roberts is one of the greatest British historians alive today and so, this week, I decided to read another of his works: 'George III: The Life

& Reign of Britain's Most Misunderstood Monarch'.

As the title suggests, this is very much a revisionist work, in that Roberts up-ends much of what we thought we knew of George III. George is remembered chiefly for his bouts of madness and for the fact that he lost Britain's American colonies. Not surprisingly, therefore, both topics figure highly in this biography, and Roberts does an excellent job of investigating the former whilst largely acquitting George of responsibility for the latter. I found Roberts's debunking of the American foundational myth especially entertaining. The founding fathers of the United States could have stated, quite simply (and, indeed, legitimately), that the colonies had reached sufficient maturity to be able to govern themselves. Instead, they created a litary of lies: claiming that they were being oppressed by tyranny, being taxed unfairly and so forth. Whereas, in reality, they had all the benefits of union with Britain (including armed help to resist French forces in Quebec), whilst contributing very little in return. Indeed, it is telling that they waited until after the defeat of the French in Canada before making a bid for independence.

Yet, there was a good deal more to George's almost 60-year reign than events in North America, and Roberts sheds a good deal of light upon a man who was much misunderstood, both during his lifetime and since his death. A committed Christian, a devoted husband (he was the only king between Charles I and George V to be faithful to his wife), a loving father, and a committed patron of the arts and sciences, George was sensible, sober-minded, and

conscientious. One of the few blots on George's record was his determined opposition to Catholic emancipation (which did not come about until 1829, some 9 years after his death). It was not that George was intolerant of Catholics per se, only that he genuinely (if mistakenly) believed that agreeing to admit Catholics to public office etc. would be to break his Coronation Oath to uphold the Church of England. It was a measure of George's integrity that he took that oath so seriously. I felt much better informed for having read this book and I would not hesitate to recommend it accordingly.
