Next Sunday there will be the opportunity for Parishioners to receive the *Sacrament of the* 

Anointing of the Sick. As is the Oratory custom, this takes place during Mass. Those wishing to receive the Sacrament should stand or indicate to the priest their wish to do so. The housebound of the Parish who have not received the Sacrament within the last month will be visited. Every Jubilee Holy Year has works of charity, repentance, confession, penance and absolution of sin at its very heart. Pope Francis reasserted this fundamental Catholic doctrine when he opined:

Forgiveness makes possible a brighter future, which enables us to look at the past with different eyes, now more serene, albeit still bearing the trace of past tears. .... In this Jubilee Year, may no one be deprived of the opportunity to receive God's forgiveness and consolation. *(Spes non confundit n.23)*

#### "A 2025 INITIATIVE" LATEST NEWS: Restoration Work "Parish Stewardship: Our Task"

The restoration works moved on this week with the laying of the stone bases for the

siting of the railings along the east end of the church where the drains were excavated and replaced some months ago and also the excavation and replacement of the broken drains. along the north side of the church. The builders

responsible for the construction of the access ramp and new stone surfacing to correspond with the front of the church will arrive hopefully in the next fortnight. As is evident, a temporary access ramp has been manufactured and sited on the front of the church. Thank you to those parishioners who returned their Weekly Giving Envelopes or Online Planned Giving Forms last week. It is very encouraging. Please if you



haven't completed the form or have lost it, there are more forms at the back of the church for you to commit to the Parish. 20% +

# Books Woof I Have Read *by* Pippo

This week, I read the recently-published 'Unleashed', by Boris Johnson, which is a memoire of the author's political career as mayor of London, foreign

secretary, and prime minister. The difficulty with Boris, of course, is that one cannot mention his name without provoking a strong reaction. Some see him as moral vacuum who should never have been allowed anywhere near public office. Some see him as a clown who was bound to come unstuck eventually. Some see him as a shrewd operator whose luck ran out. Others see him as a force for positive change who, like others before him, was stabbed in the back by his own party. Almost no-one is without an opinion.

The first thing I would say about this book, however, is that I found it extremely readable. That is probably not surprising when one remembers that its author was, first and foremost, a very successful journalist. He knows how to write something which will attract (and hold) the attention of a busy reader; and, with references ranging from Voltaire to Peppa Pig, the book was nothing if not amusing. That said, there were a few occasions when the book could not help grating, with the same tired, old catchphrases being bandied around with regards to getting Brexit done, levelling up, and so on. Moreover, regardless of where you stand on issues such as Brexit, I don't think any of us would be in a hurry to re-live the experience (which, to some extent, reading this book compels one to do).

This book revealed Johnson to be much more selfeffacing than I expected. He was perfectly willing to admit to several errors of judgment. It was also fascinating to read his version of what was going on behind the scenes when most of us were trying to make sense of what we were seeing in the media. There are those who may not necessarily believe that version of events, of course, but I think it is better to form a view with the benefit of reading this book, rather than without.
