"Parish Stewardship: Our Task"

This week I paid the invoice for £3,859.78

for the upgrading of the new choirs' room adjacent to the bar in the Parish Hall. This was necessary in consideration of the H&S risks associated with the choirs' continued use of the old music room, originally built as a tribune for priests of the house. The stone steps in the tower to access the tribune are a concern. The new arrangement is superior being ground floor accessible, next to the hall where the choirs practise and covered by CCTV to be compliant with the requirements of Safeguarding.

The second bill was for £12,549.06 for the repairs to the parapet, re-dress the lead, remove and repair, replace perished slate roof tiles over the tribune and the sanctuary, insulate, place new battens over the tribune and sanctuary. It also included the hiring of the cherry picker to replace the solitary broken roof slate on the highest elevation of the church roof and to avail of the opportunity to clean out all high level guttering and snow boxes.

It's simple. Whatever your present Stewardship Giving is to the Oratory Parish week in and week out, the Parish needs your support. In order to increase *your own* individual weekly giving

to the Parish without having to give a penny more, I ask every adult Parishioner to sign up to the Weekly Giving Envelopes or Online Planned Giving. The Oratory as a registered



charity can claim 20%+ on all such planned giving, and there are no administration costs to eat into that sum. Planned Giving is confidential and governed by the laws on data protection. All that is required is that the person whose name is on the box is a tax payer. St John Henry Newman said: "Give back some of God's gifts to God, that you may safely enjoy the rest." In signing up, you will greatly assist your Parish Priest and remove from him the burden and anxiety of being confronted with increasing expenditure and static giving. God bless you.



Books Woof I Have Read by Pippo

This week, I finally got around to reading 'Dominion: The Making of the Western Mind', by Tom Holland. As a keen listener to the Rest is History podcast - and, indeed, a proud member of the Rest is History

Club – I have wanted to read this book for quite some time. Those who are familiar with Tom Holland's work will know that he is keenly interested in the role which Christianity has had in shaping Western values. As Holland himself put it, this book is not a history of Christianity. Rather, it is a history of what has been revolutionary and transformative about Christianity. It is not just how Christianity has transformed the West, but the entire world.

The central thesis of this book is that the way we in the West view life and the world (that is, our morality, values, and social norms) are all products of Christianity. In fact, we are so deep-rooted in Christianity that most people do not know to what extent we have been shaped by it. Many Christian concepts have become so universal that, as Holland puts it, their origins have come to be hidden from view.

Far from being confined to the last 2,000 years (as one might expect), this book goes back much further. Holland looks at many ancient, pre-Christian civilizations, such as those of Greece, Persia and Old Testament Judaism, in order to illustrate just how revolutionary Christianity was, and how it altered the course of humanity thereafter.

One of the things I liked most about this book was that it does not attempt to paint Christianity in a positive or a negative light. It just sticks to the facts. Since the author has no obvious agenda, the book is all the more interesting (and compelling). I very much enjoyed this book and would not hesitate to recommend it.
